2015 NAWT Hapchuck Scholarship

The deadline for the **2016 NAWT Hapchuck Scholarship** must be received or postmarked by **January 1, 2016** in order to be considered for the scholarship. The scholarship application has been posted and additional details can be found on NAWT's website.

Hapchuk Scholarship Assignment for 2016

Option One

In option one the assignment is to build a short story around the two photographs (included on page 3). A homeowner is meeting with the septic professional to discuss why his system is not working properly as indicated by the floating manhole riser. The story should include why the system may have gotten that way and what will need to be done.

Information provided in the short story should be referenced to websites or articles where the information can be found. You can change or enhance the photos and be creative about how the story is told. It can be a written story (no more than 1500 words).

Option Two

Using these same two photographs, in option two the assignment is to create a short video that could serve as a public service announcement that could relate to homeowners on how to avoid having this problem. A video; cartoon etc. is acceptable. Be creative!

The goal of the Vacuum Truck training course is that at the conclusion of the session participants should be able to recognize the following:


- trucks and their associated equipment

It is the time of the year to remind everyone to prepare nominations for the next National Association of Wastewater Technicians Excellence in Service Award. This is your opportunity to recognize someone that you have noticed goes beyond the ordinary. This is an opportunity to recognize our peers for all their hard work and service. The award is presented annually at the state association breakfast during the Water & Wastewater Equipment, Treatment & Transport show (WWETT) just before presentation of the Ralph Macchio Lifetime Achievement Award. The 2016 breakfast will be held on Friday, February 19, 2016 in Indianapolis.

The NAWT Board established the Excellence in Service Award in 2010 as an update to the former Man of the Year award. Establishment of this award reflected the changing industry and provides the opportunity to recognize any individual or company the NAWT board feels has exhibited exceptional service to the wastewater profession. The nomination criteria and instructions are provided below. Nominations should be submitted by November 1, 2015.

Basis for Award

To recognize a NAWT member or NAWT-sponsored individual or company that has shown exceptional accomplishments in their service to the community and to the wastewater profession.

Nomination Criteria

The Excellence in Service Award is based on one or more of the following criteria:

- A significant contribution to the wastewater profession and/or to NAWT
- Commendable service during a significant community or national event within the last several years
- Additional responsibilities that resulted in a benefit to the community or wastewater industry

- Actions performed above and beyond the call of duty
- Provided inspiration to others
- Exhibited exceptional leadership

- Nonmembers may make recommendation through any NAWT member or liaison

Who can be nominated?

- Anyone who meets the nomination criteria
- Past non-winning nominees

When to submit nominations:

- All nomination forms must be received by or postmarked Nov. 1 of each year. Any applications received after the deadline will be placed on file for the next calendar year.
 - All post-deadline nominators will be notified of this fact and given further instructions.

The NAWT field trip is scheduled for Friday, November 6th and will be held at the Hampton Roads Sanitation District's Nansemond Treatment Facility where septage is accepted and processed. Attendees will see a receiving area using an automated creative technique for documenting the waste received. They will also see a dewatering/solidification area simple enough to incorporate into anyone's facility. Centrifuges are used at the Nansemond facility to dewater both the septage delivered by haulers and sludge generated by the plant treatment process. Attendees will see the centrifuges in operation. In addition, vendors will be onsite with live demonstrations of various pieces of screening and dewatering equipment working with septage and grease trap waste. There will be ample time to interface with those in attendance. This will be a real 'hands on' opportunity for those with disposal issues that want to take control of their disposal destiny!
